The SSLAS workshop on "Contested Heritage of Latin American" brings together comparative research on illegal trade heritage, museum collections, and coloniality. It examines the role of the antiquities market and the formation of museum collections, with a particular focus on antiquities.

The workshop also engages with current debates on the decolonization of museum and academic practices, addressing how colonial legacies continue to shape the circulation, display, and interpretation of Latin American culture and heritage. It highlights the absence of the voices of communities of origin, whose cultural and spiritual heritage is often implicated in processes of extraction and commodification. The role of Switzerland, as both a transit and destination country in the (il)legal antiquities trade, will be explored within a broader reflection on the responsibilities of institutions and states in the Global North. The workshop will likewise analyse the historical and legal context in which Swiss collectors acquired Latin American antiquities.

Presentations will explore these practices, as well as national and international efforts to better understand the dynamics of (il)legal activity in the antiquities market, and how such understanding can contribute to more ethical and inclusive approaches to heritage practices.

The official talks of the workshop are in Spanish, Portuguese and English.


